

Privacy Policy

For the purpose of GDPR The 45 Seniors Tennis Club is the data controller in relation to carrying out the objectives of the organisation. Its members are the data subjects.

In order to carry out Club activities it is necessary to store and use some or all of the following personal data for each member:

- Member's Name and Membership Number.
- Postal Address.
- Email Address.
- Phone number.
- Date of Birth
- Gender
- Membership Category, (Standard, Honorary).
- Membership Status, (Active,)
- Membership history
- Medical information
- Emergency contact

The above information is collected by completion of an application form, or by an email request and is held within a web-based platform.

- Some of the above information above is required so that The 45 Seniors Tennis Club can tell its members about:
 - Forthcoming tournaments and matches.
 - Tennis events.
 - Other tennis-related and social events which might be of interest to members.
- The above information is held in a database controlled solely by The 45 Senior's Tennis Club.
- The above information is only available to a small number of committee members for the purpose of managing the club.
- We maintain a list of email addresses and telephone numbers of members who have given their permission for this data to be held and made available to other club members for communication purposes (e.g. arrangement of games and matches)
- The above information will not be shared with third parties unless express permission has been sought and granted.
- Contact details for Committee members, Team Captains will be made available on the website as required.
- The above information will be retained until such time as you request it to be deleted or until you cease to be a member.
- If at any time you believe the information held by The 45 Senior's Tennis Club is incorrect you can request to see it and have it corrected or deleted by contacting the Membership Secretary.
- If you believe that The 45 Senior's Tennis Club is not using your information in accordance with the law you can complain to the Information Commissioner's Office. You may request to have your data status changed at any time.
